Some time ago we ran across an interesting article about Winston Churchill. Apparently, Churchill had requested that when he died, and the memorial service for him had ended, a bugler would be poised to play the mournful notes of taps. The tune that signals the dying of day would then signal to all in attendance the dying of a life. "Day is done, gone the sun."

But, just as the notes of taps faded, again at Churchill's request, a second bugler was to put his instrument to his lips and began to play reveille. "It's time to get up. It's time to get up in the morning!" So strong was Churchill's trust in the assurance that eternity awaited him, that he chose this musical demonstration of it. Taps would not be the end of his life's story! Reveille would be.

Easter is coming to us after a year of so many losses and deaths. The pandemic has brought tremendous loss of life, economic uncertainty for millions, isolation and unrest and loneliness and worry for many more.
