An Attitude of Gratitude

With Thanksgiving right around the corner, I felt that gratitude would be a fitting theme for this month's newsletter. We have a Thanksgiving tradition in my family to share what they are grateful for. But it's not that simple, first 25 people have to scrunch and scootch in around one long table that stretches from the kitchen, through the dining room, and end just short of the fireplace in the living room. Once everyone is seated, we begin with a blessing. Then, after the champagne, or wine, or sparkling apple cider has filled the glasses, and the turkey, stuffing, mashed potatoes,... you get the picture, once that's all been passed, which feels like hours, the gratitude games begin.

The first part is pretty low pressure, Amanda, my wife, starts us out with what she is most grateful for and then calls on someone else, there is one rule, however, you can't say "family", too easy. It goes on like this till all 25 have said their gratuities. Then things get more interesting, while setting the table, Amanda selects several random plates to place a "Gratitude Card" undemeath to which some unsuspecting turkey lover will be asked to respond. The cards and lucky contestants are revealed once the dishes are cleared and the responses are then digested along with the meal, all in preparation for dessert.

Gratitude is one of those things that most people don't think about enough but there are little things we can do to practice being grateful. It may be something like I described above, but I think gratitude deserves more attention than a once-a-year go-around-the-table. Studies show that practicing an attitude of gratitude improves sleep, builds healthy relationships, and reduces depression to name just a few things. So, what's a gratitude practice you might be wondering, here are a few examples:

- -Gratitude Journaling-Simply writing down what you are grateful for in that moment, in that day, or in your life. Type it in your notes on your phone, or a journal, or of course there's an app for that.
- -Gratitude Letters-Write a letter, type an email, or send a text to someone for whom you are grateful for no other reason than to say, "I am grateful for you!"
- -Gratitude Jar-Keep a jar out where it's easy to access along with a bunch of strips of paper. Each time you feel grateful, write it down and put it in the jar. Then, when your feeling blue, pull out a strip of paper to remind you of what you're grateful for.
- -Gratitude Walk-Go for a walk and think only of what you are grateful for, friends, family, pets, that butterfly over there, the cloud that looks like a cheeseburger, oh I'm grateful I have food.

The idea is to get into the practice of being grateful for everything that God has given to us. "Be thankful in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you who belong to Christ Jesus." — 1 Thessalonians 5:18 As for me, I am grateful for all of you,


