

Advent 2022

Well...Advent, as a seminarian and a pastor, is a challenging and busy time. With over 40 pages of final papers and another 40 minutes of final presentations due in the coming weeks, Advent is not only a time of preparation and celebration of the coming Christ, but a time of prepare then celebrate the end of the semester. As I was doing more preparing, this time for the December newsletter article, I came across an article that took the words right out of my mouth, or rather, my page. So, instead of reinventing the wheel, I'd like to share this article by Asheritah Ciuciu.

It's the most wonderful time of year, isn't it? And while some scoff at carols being sung on the radio before December 1, Christians throughout history have embraced this season of spiritual preparation using Advent readings—short Bible passages read during the lighting of the Advent wreath. This sacred time invites us to slow down from all the holiday preparations and parties, take a deep breath, and remember the reason for the season: the eternal Jesus Christ taking on human flesh.

If you've ever struggled to keep the four Sundays of Advent straight, you're not alone. For hundreds of years, faithful Christians have observed the four weeks leading up to Christmas Day as a special time to prepare their hearts, but these practices have changed over time and place.

The first mention of Advent is found in ancient writings dating back to the sixth century, with some anecdotal mentions as early as AD 380 at the Spanish Council of Saragossa! So not only is it an old Christian practice, but it's also a very personal one, as churches have adapted the practice to suit their local parishes.

So, while there's no authoritative guide to Advent, we can find some commonalities in the ways churches have practiced the observance of Advent throughout history.

Generally, the themes and Gospel passages from Year A in the Lectionary that correspond to each week fall into these categories:

Week 1: Hope - Matthew 24:36-44 Week 2: Peace - Matthew 3:1-12 Week 3: Joy - Matthew 11:2-11 Week 4: Love - Matthew 1:18-25 Week 5 (Christmas Eve): Adoration


While the differences in weekly Advent themes may be confusing, we can unite in our desire to quiet our hearts during a hectic holiday season and worship Jesus. And the good news is that there is no right or wrong way to observe Advent as long as you're coming to God with a sincere and open heart.
