Pastor's Report

Ecclesiastes 3:1 For everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven.

These words have offered comfort to those who are mourning loss and brought joy to those experiencing life's miracles. They have even caught the attention of the "classic rock" band, the Byrd's, which I imagine is playing in your head as you read this, it is in mine. What draws us towards these words, and the reason I chose them here is their connection between what was and what is to come. In poetic rhythm, they spur reflection, memory, and contemplation. They remind us that the past is to be cherished and the future is in God's hands. They speak to God's persistent presence, not only in what has come to pass but right now in our daily lives, and in what is yet to be. When I look to the words of Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 and reflect on my own life, I can see God at work each contrasting season or time. In the same way, we can see God at work throughout the seasons of this church. So, what season, what time do we find ourselves in at First Congregational?

With that question in mind, I'd like to invite you to pause for a moment, ask for the Holy Spirit to guide you, and read Ecclesiastes 3:1-8, I'll wait. The overarching theme I hear when reading this is liminality. Being stuck between the "glory days" and new possibilities. I hear the pain and frustration, not only from not being the church it used to be but also from not knowing what the future holds, wedged between not wanting to let go and at the same time reaching towards what God has in store. Here, the word transition comes to mind, however, God doesn't really do transition, God transforms. God takes what was and makes it new. This is both a time to be born and a time to die(metaphorically speaking); it's both a time to break down and build up; it's both a time to mourn and to dance. What a great time to be church, God does amazing things in seasons of liminality.

So here we are, in truth, we cannot really be anywhere else but here...in this season, in this time. It's unlike anything the church, or society for that matter, has faced or is likely to face again. Exciting? Yes! Worrisome? Of course! So, what's a church to do? Well, sometimes the only thing we can do is show up, show up, and see where the Holy Spirit takes us. If you have been attending regularly, thank you and I encourage you to keep showing up, and if it's been a while, I'd like to invite you to start showing up again.

I look forward in faith that the Holy Spirit will lead us on our journey through this liminal season so that, together, we can discern what God has in store for us in this unique season and time at First Congregational.
