ENGAGING ADVENT



Each Sundays of Advent, we will not only be lighting candles, but we will take a moment to engage with the theme of the Day by creating an "Advent Word Cloud" in real time. In case you are wondering what a word cloud is, it is a shared collection of responses to a particular prompt. For example, the 1st Sunday's theme is **Hope** and the prompt is "In 1 or 2 words, share what brings you Hope?". Responses will anonymously and automatically appear on the screen, sharing what brings everyone hope as one big "Advent Cloud of Hope"! Check out the example below.

So, how does it work? Simply scan the QR Code in the bulletin or on the screen or go to **wooclap.com** and enter the code **1STCONGO** then just type your answer and hit "Submit". If you don't have a phone, ask someone next to you to share. Viewers on Facebook Live can play too, just follow the same instructions or type your answer in the comments.

Team Operating Principles

"Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms." 1 Peter 4:10

Before we begin this shift from a committee structure to a Team model, it is important to consider, or maybe remind yourself of, your gifts, abilities and talents. The most effective team is one made up of a wide variety of people sharing their unique gifts and talents for the benefit of the Team and thus the church, community, and ultimately, God.

The very first thing for us to do is get familiar with the Team or Team's descriptions and duties that, because you served on the former committee, are part of. Before you panic, keep in mind that just because you served on a former committee doesn't necessarily mean you are automatically on that Team now. For this reason, it is important that **every person** from the former committees that make up the Team shows up to the first meeting. This, in most cases, will be more people than are needed to serve on the Team, and that's a good thing. Team members will be decided at the first Team meeting as each Team functions as an independent group that manages their own schedule, tasks, and members.

Time for the first meeting! Take some time to talk before getting down to business. Ask questions, complain, share pictures of your dog, pray. Once you're ready, here are some suggestions to get things off and running: (See Team Form)

- 1. Determine a <u>Team Manager</u> Team Manager will be responsible for the overall management, organization and reporting of team activities. The Team Manager will be the team's liaison to the Leadership Team and attend Leadership Team meetings.
- 2. Determine <u>Leaders</u> for each of the Team's components found within the Team's "circle" on diagram on page 9.
 - a. For example, under the Discipleship Team, the category of Christion Education will have one "Leader" representing that aspect of the team's duties. The CE Leader is responsible for the tasks corresponding to CE but will also be supported by the remaining Discipleship Team members.
 - b. Teams, managers, and Leaders are encouraged to gather others from the Team and congregation to assist, manage and/or perform the short and long-term goals and needs of CE.
- 3. Discuss goals, tasks, and schedules.

No doubt, this is a big change, but there have been even bigger changes in the world around us. Innovation, adaptation, and imagination are a necessary part of being able to continue the long heritage of loving ministry First Congregation has and continues to experience.

- 1. Call To Order The meeting was called to order by Stan at 7:00pm.
- 2. Opening Prayer Our opening prayer was given by Pastor Adam.
- 3. Approval of Minutes —The Minutes from September 20th were approved as written.

4. Pastor's Report

• Pastor Adam will work with the confirmation students, over the next few weeks, to construct the Little Lending Library.

5. Committee Reports

Trustees

Karr Tuckpointing provided a proposal for the work to be done at church. The bid is \$39,573, with work proposed to begin in the spring of 2024. It was noted that this work has not been done for 7 to 8 years. Carmen asked that this item be placed on the Agenda at the Annual Meeting for action. In addition — Brian Nagel has repaired the urinal leak in the 1st floor men's bathroom and repaired the outside faucet leak.

Christian Education -

Bridget reported on the results of the October 1st meeting to gain more volunteers to help with Sunday School. A schedule has been set up that will incorporate the leadership of Amy Smith taking over the day-to-day operations and leading classes as she is able. Parents of the other students will take over in her absence. Supplies have been moved to the "new" preschool room and are ready to have the furniture brought in with the help of the Deacons.

Deacons –

Jim, speaking for the Deacons, expressed concern over losing their autonomy as a group within the Worship and Welcome Team as well as a reduction in their participation numbers. After discussion it was agreed that the group to which they are assigned will be named the Deacons Worship and Welcome Team and be comprised of 9-12 members. They will share in the duties of the other groups already named to fulfill the duties of this team.

Troy reported that Jim Cox has been selected to be the Chair of the Deacons beginning with the 2023-24 season, already underway.

• Deaconesses - Nothing new to report, as per Jan.

OLD BUSINESS

- A. <u>Update on Heating System Repairs</u> Mike Dahlke provided blueprints to Foster Mechanical who will present a proposal on the work. An estimate is not expected till winter.
- B. <u>Constitution Changes</u> Pastor Adam and Stan lead us through the proposed changes to the Church's Constitution. Adjustments will be made and sent out to church members along with the Annual Report.
- c. <u>Discussion Concerning SLS Services</u> Stan read a list of the pros and cons for continuing business with SLS, at Jan's request. Carmen reported on issues the Trustees have been having and current problems reconciling the books in advance of the Annual Budget report. On a 7 to 1 vote, it was approved to drop SLS as our accounting service at the end of the annual year.

D. Auditing the Church Books - Carmen reported that he had made an announcement two weeks ago, in church, asking for two volunteers to audit the church books as per our current constitutional guidelines. No one had come forward. The Council discussed the timeframe needed and cost for a private CPA firm to do the work and the timetable required to complete the job for inclusion in the Annual Report. Deciding this was not achievable, it was suggested that the more practical time for this report to be done would be after the decision is made with regard to our continued relationship with SLS.

NEW BUSINESS

A. Changing the church's fiscal year - It was decided to add another item to the Annual Report Agenda, asking members their thoughts about keeping the church budget year to September 1 – August 31 or moving it to January 1 – December 31.

MOTION TO ADJOURN: Troy motioned to adjourn the meeting and Carmen seconded the motion. Meeting adjourned at 8:48pm. Motion carried unanimously.

- 1. Call To Order The meeting was called to order by Stan at 7:05pm.
- 2. Opening Prayer Our opening prayer was given by Pastor Adam.
- 3. Approval of Minutes The Minutes from October 4th were approved as corrected.

4. Pastor's Report

New Church Constitution - Pastor Adam distributed a finished copy of the amended Church Constitution (Oct. 29, 2023) which was reviewed... On Page 5 a decision was made to reword the last line under General Rules and Responsibilities. "All Teams will have a quorum of 51% or more (in person) to conduct a meeting" has been replaced by the wording from Article VII: Business Meetings, Section 3, (page 8) that says" "An affirmative majority vote of members present will constitute a Quorum at any regular or specials meeting of the church",

<u>Team Meetings</u> – Pastor Adam distributed a handout titled Team Operating Principles for review which identifies the various new Teams and how each team will be filled with representatives. A Team Manager will be selected and this person will be the representative who will attend the Leadership Team Church Council) meetings.

The general duties of the Team Members within their teams are explained under Article VI including being asked to serve a two year term and meet monthly as a Team. Pastor Adam and Stan expressed interest in each Church Council member reaching out now to the team/s they currently represent and gather for their first meeting.

<u>Trunk-N-Treat</u>- A very successful event took place October 31st with seven cars providing creative stops for trick-or-treating in front of the church. Over 100 children attended our first event at the church. Cold weather may have influenced people to attend with carfuls of kids.

GienFields Painted Pumpkins Give-AwayThe 20 people who attended the Chapel service received their pumpkins in person by our Sunday School kids and the remainder were distributed to those napping, at the time. Many people expressed their pleasure in being remembered.

<u>Little Library Update</u> – Ethan Lehmann was instrumental in the roof installation for the Little Library. Next is paint and outdoor installation.

<u>UCC Co-Op Meeting</u> — The next meeting will be held Dec 2nd at New Journey. This meeting, available on Zoom, will be to discuss the future of the churches in our area and what we can do. Expected participants include Pastors Penny, Scott, Brian, Al, Pastor Adam +/- others.

- <u>Tuckpointing Job</u> <u>Trustees accepted the bid by Karr Tuckpointing for \$39,573.00 at their November meeting.</u> Work will begin in the spring of 2024.
- Church Heating/Air Systems A bid for the church's heating system was received by Foster Mechanical in the amount of \$108,000. A meeting has been scheduled for December 20th to review the bid details.

Miscellaneous

- Winter Snow Removal -Neubarth Landscape Co. has not provided a bid for snow removal services after repeated calls by Carmen to their office. Carmen will pursue other vendors if they do not provide a bid in the next week.
- <u>Sunday School Room Plumbing</u> Brian Nagel has declined to provide a bid for the plumbing repairs citing the difficulty and magnitude of the project.
- <u>Bat Update</u> -Our contract with the Bat Company has expired and they have said we should look for another company in the future as they were not pleased working with members of our Buildings and Grounds committee.
- Winter Heat Update Roger Landon visited the church and turned on the furnace before checking with our current Buildings and Ground staff, causing confusion and concern for making these changes without any notification.
- <u>Boulevard Handrall</u> -Ann Wangerin has volunteered her husband to build and install a handrail next to the boulevard on the west side of the church to assist in the slippery sidewalk issue there. Gopher One will be called along with Century Link for wires and the City of Glencoe to determine if a permit is necessary.
- Internet Problems Pastor Adam noted the internet service has been horrible causing him to leave work early on Monday. He put a service call in to Century Link.
- RTZ Value Inspection Wendy and Mike D. were notified of an Inspection necessary. Mike has contacted Foster Mechanical who will handle this.
- Mike Dahlke has announced that he is stepping down from the Buildings and Grounds Committee April 1st.

<u>Discipleship Team - (Christen Education, Missions & Benevolence, Stewardship, Memorial)</u>

• Bridget reported that plans are underway for The Christmas Story presentation by Sunday School students and other church members on December 17th. Several folks have already signed up. Sunday School is proceeding as planned.
