

- 1. Call to Order the meeting was called to order by Stan at 7:00pm
- 2. Pastor Adam provided the opening prayer.
- 3. Carmen moved to approve the December minutes, Kari gave the second, motion passed.
- 4. Pastor's Report: Pastor relayed that his intense class time is over, but will have classes through the summer. The upcoming Lenten schedule will start on 2/14 at First Congregational, 2/21 at Frieden's, 2/28 at First Congregational, 3/6 in Giencoe, hosted by St. Johns/Bongard's, 3/13 at St. Paul's Plato, 3/20 at Frieden's. Maundy Thursday service will be held at Individual churches on 3/29, Easter is on 3/31. Joint mission at Feed My Starving Children is being planned for 4/20/24 with other churches from 9:30-11am. - Resource Team: (trustees) Pledges as of 12/23 are \$5441.00, in 12/22 it was \$10,695
  Total income right now = \$90,017 for 2023.
  \$28k in a Miska CD will be put into a money market for heating, tuckpointing and plumbing instead of renewing. The police department have requested that three people be listed as overnight contacts in case of any issues. Stan, Carmen and Jim have agreed to be listed as contacts.

- 9. Worship & Welcome Team: meeting on 1/28 after church.
