The Weekend Meals program, which began in 2011, is now serving almost 400 children in McLeod County. About 140 of these children (grades K-12) come from Glencoe and Lester Prairie Schools. Weekend meals are provided for students who qualify for Education Benefits (previously Free Lunch Program). Brown paper bags are sent home on Fridays filled with nutritious, easy to prepare meals that children can make on their own, if needed.

There are two ways you can help support this valuable program: Financial Support - It costs about \$6.00/week to fill each bag. Your cash donation allows the volunteers to buy products, in bulk, ensuring the best price possible. We will be collecting contributions through February.

ASSISTS WITH INDIVIDUAL AND FAMILY FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE AND OTHER PERSONAL ITEMS

Common Cup never pays an entire bill and collaborates with County Assistance/UCAP. C/Cup keeps files on all those we serve and have a limit of \$200-\$300 every 3-4 years (case by case).

### Areas of Assistance include

- Assist with utility bills/propane/fuel oil
- Assist with Gas Voucher for:
  - 1. Proven Medical Appointment that they had either that day or proof they were there in the past two days.
  - 2. Proven Job Interview that they are returning from that can be verified.
  - 3. First 2 weeks of work and have not received a paycheck.
- Assist with Application Fee to an Apartment (unless felonies or evictions that would prohibit acceptance
- Assist with deposit on an apartment and/or first month's rent.
- Assist with co-pays of medications if clients are on MN Care or that have applied.
- Assist with car insurance only if under \$200 and client has a verified job.

# FIRST CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH Leadership Team Minutes January 15, 2025 DRAFT

- 1. Call To Order The meeting was called to order by Stan at 7:05 p.m.
- 2. Opening Prayer The opening prayer was given by Pastor Adam.
- 3. Approval of Minutes A motion to approve the December minutes, as written, was made by Jim and seconded by Jan. Motion approved.

## 4. Pastor Adam's Report/Update

- An advertisement was placed on the Glencoe Chamber of Commerce website and Life in Glencoe page, seeking interested people to operate a preschool or daycare at our church. A few inquiries were received but nothing firm has come from this yet.
- Cameras and Wi-Fi materials were purchased and Pastor Adam has begun installation.
- Nuvera has prewired our new system for the elevator and phones but is not yet completed.
- A New Member Class began Wednesday with 5 individuals and one member interested in learning more about congregationalism. Dan Kottke provided the group a history of the church and a walking tour of the building. The next class will focus on the UCC fundamentals. Stan asked what the "UCC" designation brings to "us". Pastor Adam described the UCC as more progressive than standard churches, providing an "identity" and the opportunity for local giving and serving others.
- No one, other than Pastor Adam, attended the Glencoe-Silver Lake ministerial lunch meeting.
- The mid-week Lenten Service schedule is being drawn up with the other churches.
- Pastor Adam's vacation is scheduled from February 13 -24. He is looking for some options to our typical pulpit supply individuals. Various names were discussed. He will also be setting up someone as an emergency contact while he is away, possibly Brian Brosz.

#### 5. TEAM LEADER REPORTS

#### A. Resource Team

**2024 Pledges**December \$24,827.25

**Total for Year** \$ 90,056.81

- 1. A heating problem detected January 12th, with a relay switch, not installed by Foster Mechanical, required their service and a bill will follow.
- 2. Foster Mechanical completed the RSV heating system test required by the State.
- 3. A local resident, with a valid Boiler License began working for the church this week. Kelly Rach was instrumental in securing his services. He will be paid \$100 monthly for this service and will use the checklist hanging in the boiler room. John Lemke, who provided this service in the past is reducing his workload and wasn't interested in continuing his employment with the church.
- 4. The church's insurance policy comes due the first of April. The new rate reflects an increase of 8 percent, for a total of \$17,606.

#### B. Discipleship Team

 Missions – The list of Missions of the Month program for 2025 was finalized at the Dec. 1st meeting. Team leaders were chosen for each event and are responsible for the publicity and follow-through. January's Mission is Dollars for Diapers and proceeds will go to Common Cup. February is also a Common Cup program serving school age children with the Weekend Meals program. In March we're supporting the McLeod Food Shelf. Stan asked about the procedure to write checks and how the donations get to the recipient. Pastor Adam will remind donors of the procedure and Bridget will add it to the church Announcements and make envelopes for those who want to use one.

2. <u>Christian Education</u> – Classes have suffered a bit with Amy being sick. Barb has stepped up to work with Vickie.

### C. Deacons

1. The bulk of December was spent organizing activities related to the Christmas service.

2. The Deacons will be reviewing the church Membership List with the names provided by Wendy, Randy Warner and with previous records to bring our count up-to-date. It was recommended that cards be made where those at the Annual Meeting can provide their current personal information.

#### D. Worship and Welcome Team

1. Jan thanked those who have helped in the preparation of the Communion service monthly.

#### 6. Old Business

A. Review of Budget Pages – Stan commented on a variety of pages in the Annual Report about their meanings. Carmen gave a brief recap of what each page represents. Carmen reported that Kelly Rach will be in attendance at the meeting and will lead the discussion about the various accounts. She is putting an investment spreadsheet together to make the budget contents more easily understandable. It was suggested that this page be shown on the screen so people can more easily follow along.

In response to a question by Stan about Wendy's understanding of the current Quickbooks program, Pastor Adam said she has a much better handle of the funds than previously. It was noted that bringing the system back in-house will provide better control of the recordskeeping.

#### 7. New Business

- A. <u>Discussion of Painting in the Church Basement -</u> Jan and Bridget briefly described the conversation held at the Women's Fellowship Meeting in December. Several women expressed the need to freshen up the Fellowship Hall. The consensus was that this was a good idea and "we" should look into the cost of the project. It was suggested that this type of project could be covered by Buildings and Grounds so Carmen was contacted. He obtained three bids and took these to the Resource Team for review. The Resource Team approved the project and selected the best bid. Since that time church members have expressed their disapproval of the project. To resolve the issue, the project has been put on hold and will be added to the Agenda for the Annual Meeting.
- 8. Motion to Adjourn Jim motioned, which Jan seconded, to adjourn the meeting at 8:05pm.
